Keep on top of the signs of wear and tear.

Keep a file with manuals, invoices and certifications together.

3

Keep a detailed list with notes on any problems, repairs and replacements.

4

Make regular visual inspections of equipment and check for any unusual sounds.

5

Any downtime should be logged, and feedback obtained from all members of staff.

6

Rating system for each piece of equipment to prioritise maintenance or replacement.
